

Understand resources covered in ProQuest Education database



Education Database

The *Education Database* gives users access to over 1,000 top educational publications, including more than 800 of the titles in full text. There are more than 2.2 million records to-date, including 50K plus dissertations and theses. Approximately 75% of the publications included in this database are scholarly journals.

- Offering complete information on hundreds of educational topics, this database offers complete text and images from journals such as:
 - *Childhood Education*
 - *College Teaching*
 - *Harvard Educational Review*
 - *Journal of Athletic Training*
 - *Educational Theory*



Education Databases

The Education Database covers not only the literature on primary, secondary, and higher education but also special education, home schooling, adult education, and hundreds of related topics. The majority of the content spans from 1980-present, but there are earlier documents and articles included.







Boolean / Logical Operators

OR

→ either term must be present




Ex:

Chrome **OR** Firefox



Boolean / Logical Operators

AND → both / all terms must be present



Ex:

Web **AND** Browser

NOTE:

AND is implied between terms separated by a space


CANCER RESEARCH → CANCER AND RESEARCH



Boolean / Logical Operators

NOT

→ eliminates hits with the term after NOT operator



Ex:

railway **NOT** strike

Beware!

ENERGY NOT NUCLEAR will eliminate

“Alternatives to Nuclear Energy.”



Search Defaults

- Queries with more than one word separated by space such as **advertising campaigns** are searched with an implicit **AND**.
- Use quotation marks (""") to search for **Exact phrases**
“advertising campaigns”
- If a specific field is not entered with a search query, the **default** is to search

Anywhere (all indexed fields of the full record + full text in F-T DBs)

or

Anywhere except full text choice available in F-T DBs

(all indexed fields of the full record, ¹⁷excluding the full-text)



Truncation

- * The **Truncation character asterisk** is used to replace one or more characters (from 0 up to max 10 Characters).
- ? The **Wildcard character question mark** is used to replace any single character at **right** end of the word.

Limiting the search to specific fields

Search Tips

Operators, fields, and special characters

Note: You can enter [operators](#) in either lowercase or uppercase - **OR** will work the same as **or**.

Operator	Description	Example
AND	Look for documents that contain all of your words or phrases. Use AND to narrow your search and get fewer results.	food AND nutrition
OR	Look for documents that contain any of your words or phrases. Use OR to broaden your search and get more results.	food OR nutrition
NOT	Look for documents that contain one of your search terms, but not the other.	nursing NOT shortage
NEAR/n or N/n	Look for documents that contain two search terms, in any order, within a specified number of words apart. Replace 'n' with a number. In the example, 3 means within 3 words. Used alone, NEAR defaults to NEAR/4. Important to know: When you shorten NEAR to N , you must provide a number. For example, internet N/3 media . If you search on internet N media , ProQuest interprets N as a search term, rather than as a proximity operator.	nursing NEAR/3 education media N/3 women
PRE/n or P/n or -	Look for documents that contain one search term that appears within a specified number of words before a second term. Replace 'n' with a number. In the example, 4 means the first term precedes the second term by 4 or fewer words. A hyphen (-) joining two terms within a search is equivalent to PRE/0 or P/0.	nursing PRE/4 education shares P/4 technologies nursing-education




