The Review of Educational Research publishes critical, integrative reviews of research literature bearing on education. Each issue contains four articles.


The issues topics include children's creativity, teacher qualification and quality of early childhood education, and children social-emotional functioning.

Review of Research in Education, published annually, provides a forum for analytic research reviews on selected education topics of significance to the field.


Two copies are available at the Library. This volume has 16 articles focus on teacher learning and changes in teaching practices.

Each issue contains 5-6 articles with topics on evaluating curriculum, admission and classroom policies, and funding.






Doing educational research : overcoming challenges in practice

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Teaching STEM in the preschool classroom : exploring big ideas with 3- to 5-year-olds

This book is designed to build educators' confidence and competence so they can bring STEM to life with young children. The authors encourage pre-K teachers to discover the value of engaging preschoolers in scientific inquiry, technological explorations, engineering challenges, and math experiences based on learning trajectories. If you remember, the two languages books used to be shelved separately with the Chinese books on the shorter shelves and the English books on the tall shelves. The reason for the new arrangement is to maximize shelf space while allowing users to discover books with a similar subject irrespective of the language.

Although the books are now shelved together, the language of the book can still be easily identified through the spine label - **ENG**lish in blue, and **CHI**nese in purple.
