# New citation style in AY20/21: APA 7th

The APA 6th edition (the one you've been using for your assignment in the past) has been around for 10 years. In October 2019, the 6th edition is retired as the new 7th edition is published!

The new APA 7th edition is updated with best practices in scholarly writing and publishing. It includes new student resources, student paper samples, and more reference type examples.

In AY2020-2021, you will be using the APA 7th edition citation style for your assignments.


