# Introduction

## What is Referencing?

- Citation of sources of information
- All work referenced throughout your work
- Ideas gathered and knowledge gained throughout your research process





# Information Categories

Primary Source

Secondary Source





# Primary Source

Immediate, first-hand accounts of a topic, from people who had a direct connection with it

## Examples:

Texts of laws and other original documents.

Newspaper reports, by reporters who witnessed an event or who quote people who did.

Speeches, diaries, letters and interviews - what the people involved said or wrote.

Original research.

Datasets, survey data, such as census or economic statistics.

Photographs, video, or audio that capture an event.





# Secondary Source

Added a layer of interpretation and analysis

## Examples:

Most books about a topic

Analysis or interpretation of data

Scholarly or other articles about a topic, especially by people not directly involved

Documentaries (often includes photos or video portions that can be considered primary sources)







# Secondary Reading

- Identify and evaluate the line of reasoning in the text
- Search for hidden agendas and assumptions
- Identify and evaluate the evidence used in the text
- Identify the writer's conclusions
- Decide whether the evidence used is sufficient to support the conclusions made

# What to reference

- Direct quotes
- Evidence
- Paraphrase





# Direct Quote

- Quote verbatim
- A section from other work
- Common in Arts & Humanities





# Evidence

- From datasets
- Statistics, case studies ...
- Accountable and Verifiable





# Paraphrase

- Alternative to direct quote
- As a way to provide evidence
- To express / encapsulate someone else's ideas in your own words





# Paraphrasing

## Why you might paraphrase?

- Translating technical material into simpler language
- Because lecturer / tutor has explicitly requested that you do so
- “Translating” a poem into simpler language





# What is Plagiarism?

- Academic Integrity
- Using a source without acknowledging the author
- Presenting another person's ideas or written material as your own







# Types of Plagiarism

Submitting someone else's work as your own

- A friend's essay
- An essay copied from the internet
- A purchased essay
- Asking someone else to write or rewrite your essay for submission





# Types of Plagiarism

## Creating a patchwork essay

- Bringing together paragraphs and ideas taken from different sources
- Although the research was required to find the paragraphs and ideas, your analysis or discussion of those ideas is missing
- Even if sources are cited, then what you have is research notes rather than your own essay





# Avoiding plagiarism (I)

- Cite all the material you have used, including lecture notes
- Have a clear understanding of what is, and is not, common knowledge





## Avoiding plagiarism (II)

- Keep track of your electronic resources
- File and label your sources
- Do not copy and paste material into your work
- Keep your notes and your essay draft separate
- Ensure you have cited paraphrased material explicitly
- If in doubt, delete or reference





- Rephrase original in your own wording
- To repeat certain words



# Paraphrases

Parenthetical format:

Personality develops over the lifespan (Redford, 2019).

Narrative format:

As discussed by Redford (2019), personality develops over the lifespan.





# Block Quotation

- Indent the entire quotation 0.5 in. from the left margin.
- Do not use quotation marks.
- For a parenthetical citation of a block quotation, include the author, year, and page number in parentheses after the final punctuation mark of the quotation.
- For a narrative citation of a block quotation, include the author in the narrative followed by the year in parentheses. Put the page number in parentheses after the final punctuation mark of the quotation.
- Do not add a full-stop or other end punctuation after the closing parenthesis.

# Quotations

●●● If you need to leave out some words from the quote replace them with ●●● (three dots)

**[Brackets]** to insert your own words into the quote to ensure it makes grammatical sense in your work, write your words in [square brackets] to distinguish them from the author's

**CAUTION:** In both cases be careful not to alter the meaning of the quote by removing or adding too many words

1. In Word
2. Get your reference ready
3. Highlight all the references

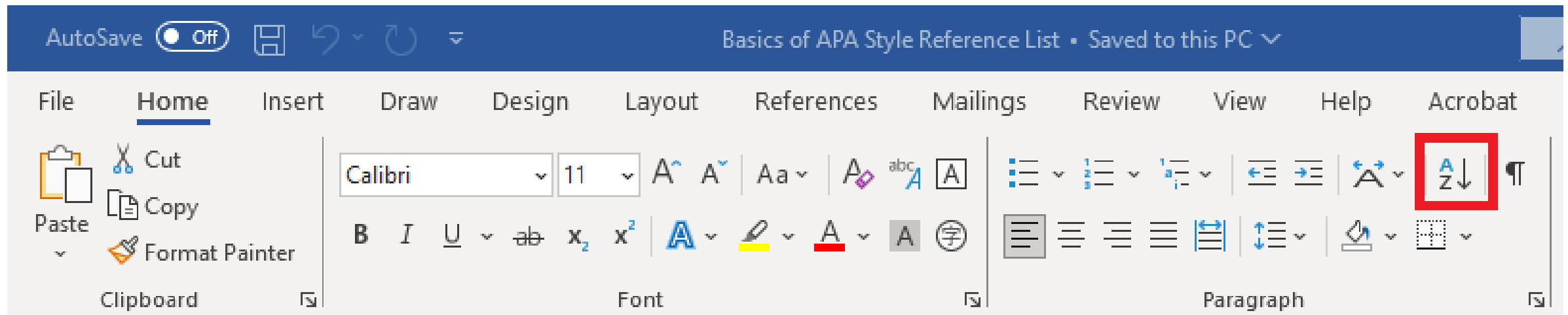
