
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

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
**Getting Started in your Educational Research / edited by Clive Opie & Desma Brown**




Why the Brain Matters: A Teacher Explores Neuroscience / by Jon Tibke

More Books & Longer Loan! New loan rules



12 New Desktop PCs & Power Strips with USB Ports




The long table is now filled with 12 new desktop computers and power strips with USB ports. (Note: The Library doesn't provide any cables, remember to bring your own!)
